

## SAR-7 EXAMINATION CREDITS AND BRIDGING EXAMINATIONS

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- GENERAL. Advisory Circulars (ACs) are issued by the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) and contain information about standards, practices and procedures acceptable to the Authority. The revision number of the AC is indicated in parenthesis in the suffix of the AC number.
- **2. PURPOSE.** This Advisory Circular (AC) is issued to advise persons of the possibility of transferring basic examination credits gained under SAR-7 to SAR-66 licensing system.
- **3. APPLICABILITY.** This AC applies to persons who have gained SAR-7 basic examination credits and wish to obtain a SAR-66 licence.
- 4. CANCELLATION. This is the first Advisory Circular issued on this subject.
- **5. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Advisory Circular is effective on 15 August 2006.
- 6. REFERENCES. SAR 66.25
- **7. INTRODUCTION.** This AC provides information on how the subjects passed under SAR-7 may be used as credits for SAR-66 basic knowledge examinations. The SAR-7 AME licensing basic examinations will remain available until end of October 2010.
- 8. DIRECT CREDITS FOR SUBJECTS PASSED UNDER SAR-7. SAR-7 AME basic examination credits on papers H11 (Human Factors and Error Management) and L11 (Airworthiness Administration) will be accepted as direct credits (i.e. one SAR-7 paper for one SAR-66 module) for SAR-66 basic knowledge examination modules M09 (Human Factors) and M10 (Aviation Legislation) respectively. This is applicable across all SAR-66 categories. H11 and L11 credits gained will be

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- subject to the same validity period 5 years as in SAR-66 (refer to SAR 66.25(d)) with immediate effect. Such credits obtained prior to 15 August 2006 will also be subject to the same validity period starting from 15 August 2006. (Some other direct credits from SAR-7 are also available but they are applicable to category A licence only. Refer to Table 1)
- 9. BRIDGING EXAMINATION FOR CATEGORY A. Refer to Table 1. SAR-7 basic examination credits may be used individually or in group to gain credits for SAR-66 category A examination modules. The bridging module, M60, is administered and conducted by CAAS.
- 10. BRIDGING EXAMINATION FOR CATEGORY B1. Refer to Table 2. CAAS does not conduct bridging examinations for category B1. The conduct of such examinations has been delegated to some SAR-147 approved training organisations. To gain the necessary credits for all the modules and sub-modules, candidates are also expected to undergo practical training and pass assessments which form part of the SAR-66 category B1 basic conversion course (BCC). Persons intending to go on a BCC with a SAR-147 approved training organisation must ensure that they have the necessary pre-requisite SAR-7 examination credits (as listed in the left column) before the commencement of the course. CAAS would not recognise the qualification if this requirement was not complied with. A list of CAAS approved organisations is available on CAAS' website (<a href="https://www.caas.gov.sg">www.caas.gov.sg</a>) and persons interested to find out more about this course or whether a particular training organisation is offering such a course, are advised to contact them directly.
- **11. BRIDGING EXAMINATION FOR CATEGORY B2.** Refer to Table 3. To qualify for a full category B2 basic licence, applicants must pass all the SAR-7 papers listed in the left column of the table. There is no bridging paper involving any SAR-66 modules.
